## **Preparatory to Research Activities Provision Guidance**

Under HIPAA, "<u>Preparatory to Research Activities</u>" are those that involve the use of potential participants' information for the purpose of preparing a research study, but not for the actual research itself. If your study involves the use of <u>Protected Health Information</u> (PHI), beyond Preparatory to Research Activities, HIPAA applies.
